

## EDITORIAL

The Proceedings of the Institute of Phonetic Sciences of the University of Amsterdam is an annual publication, intended to provide up-to-date information on current research projects in our Institute.

Proceedings 19 presents eight full papers and two summaries of recent Ph.D. and two papers based on Master's theses. The first four contributions are extended and revised versions of papers presented at the XIIIth International Congress of Phonetic Sciences, Stockholm, August 1995. The next three contributions are extended and revised versions of papers presented at Eurospeech 95, Madrid, September 1995. The eighth paper concerns research done by a guest researcher visiting our Institute, partially within the scope of the International Cooperation ERASMUS Programme on "Phonetics and Speech Communication". The summaries regard two in 1995 defended Ph.D. theses of post-graduate students, and the final two papers are based on recently finished Master's theses.

The papers on current research projects in this Proceedings represent our two main research fields:

- PERCEPTUAL AND PHYSICAL DESCRIPTION OF VARIATION AND INVARIANCE IN SPEECH
- SPEECH COMMUNICATION: DEVELOPMENT AND PATHOLOGY
